
DPHS Program Meeting with Special Guest Randle M. Biddle on February 25

Please join us on Wednesday, February 25, at 7 pm, at the City Hall Council Chambers at 33282 Golden

Lantern, above the DPHS museum for an in depth presentation about the brig PILGRIM. Many of us are familiar with Richard Henry Dana, Jr. and his voyage in the brig PILGRIM to Alta, California in 1834 from Boston, and of his return in the ship ALERT in 1835.



However, much of what has been presented about the PILGRIM since the 1840 publication of Dana's story turns out to be incorrect in many respects. Guest speaker, Randle M. Biddle, shares the findings of his extensive research (in heretofore unexamined primary source material) directed toward reconstructing the most probable appearance of the brig. Learn more about her



Palo Alto, CA, a model of the PILGRIM was rendered anew, drawing heavily on the 1830 portrait of the PILGRIM, and reconstructed in more recent fine scale model interpretations. The PILGRIM was an otherwise obscure, prosaic vessel which gained a place in history through the eyes and memories of a 19 year old who went to sea, "before the mast" for literally the voyage of a lifetime. Randy will be joined by Jeff Rosaler, former First Mate and Chief Rigger of the Ocean Institute's brig named the PILGRIM to discuss how that vessel came to be, and how it compares to what we now know of the real PILGRIM, built in Medford, Massachusetts in 1825. Reception follows at the DPHS Museum.

President's Message



Our February program will continue our celebration of Richard Henry Dana Jr.'s bicentennial year with a presentation about the brig Pilgrim, the tall ship that brought our namesake, Dana, to Capistrano Bay in 1835. Our captain on this journey is Randle M. Biddle, a published author in maritime history from Valencia, California, who builds and repairs model ships. He will share his extensive research to reconstruct the actual appearance of the Pilgrim and will present a copy of his annotated Pilgrim bibliography. Jeff Rossaler has also accepted our invitation to attend the meeting and compare Randy's observations with his experiences as First Mate and Chief

Rigger of the Ocean Institute's Pilgrim II.

Members of our Dana Bicentennial Banner Committee have met with city representatives and Dekra-Lite Graphic Designers to create banners that will proudly fly on our city's vertical light poles. Our banners will be raised throughout the city on March 16 and will commemorate Dana as well as the Fifth Annual Community Reading of his classic *Two Years Before The Mast*. The Dana Point Historical Society's goal is to inspire residents and visitors to know more about Dana's personal accomplishments and his cultural legacy.

We invite you to sponsor a banner (see insert) as a salute to the educated young man who left Harvard and signed on as a common seaman in search of physical health and adventure. At only 19 years of age, Dana had the wisdom to record his observations on the science of navigation, the life of a merchant sailor and the informal life style of California as compared to Boston. Two Years Before The Mast was an 1840s best seller, inspiring young lads to go to sea and adults to emigrate West to experience the California described by Dana during his stops along the coast. On March 27, 28 and 29 join Mayor Olvera, Sheriff Hutchens, Reverend Manson, Brad Gross and many more to become a part of our cultural history when you read aloud or listen to Richard Henry Dana's description of his voyage and "... the only romantic spot on the coast" at the Nature Interpretive Center.

March 7 is the Festival of Whales Parade and the Society's entry is a bright red 1964 Crown Firecoach Pumper generously provided by the California Fire Museum – Safety Learning Center. The pumper originally came from the Orange County Fire Authority, is used at special events and in outreach programs and will be displayed in the future California Fire Museum. Look for three of our Board of Directors riding on the truck, driven by Don Forsyth, California Fire Museum President. Please check the enclosed schedule for the DPHS Booths, Historical Walking Tours and other interesting Festival of Whales activities related to Richard Henry Dana Jr. at the Ocean Institute and onboard the brig Pilgrim II.


THE YEAR OF DANA - 2015

2015 has been designated by the Dana Point Historical Society as *The Year of Dana*, commemorating the bicentennial of Richard Henry Dana Jr.'s birth – August 1, 1815.

Please join us during our marathon reading of Dana's classic, *Two Years Before The Mast,* on March 27, 28 & 29 at the Nature Interpretive Center on the Headlands.

As a special project, beginning this year, the DPHS is purchasing 42 vertical light pole banners (seen right) for installation throughout the city of Dana Point to celebrate the life and works of our namesake. To mitigate the \$125 expense of design, purchase and installation of each banner – we invite you to become a sponsor. The 8-foot tall banners will be installed twice in 2015 – before the reading in March and during the four weeks over Dana's birthdate in August. The banners will be cleaned, stored and then installed again *each year* for the Reading of *Two Years Before The Mast* to salute the young man who so aptly described our coast in his famous book.





setting up and taking down the tent and booth each of the four days. Contact DPHSNewsletter@gmail.com if you are interested.





Dr. William F. Brown, Master Model Ship Builder

Dr. William F. Brown is a master model ship builder who has created more than 50 model ships since 1955. An Orange County native, he attended school in Anaheim, Fullerton Community College and California Medical Center in San Francisco. After graduation, he practiced dentistry in Long Beach, where he and his wife Jeane raised their two children. Dr. Brown, now 92 years of age, retired from dentistry in 1975 when he moved to Fallbrook, California, to pursue his work as a master ship modeler, gardener, to enjoy '40s music, classic cars and travel with his wife.

As a Maritime Museum of San Diego Trustee Emeritus and Advisory Committee member, Dr. Brown has a special interest in ships with important historical ties to San Diego and California, including the brig Pilgrim that brought *Two Years Before the Mast* author Richard Henry Dana Jr. to the California coast in 1835. The model of the brig Pilgrim displays incredible attention to detail and will be part of the 2015 ~ Year of Dana exhibit celebrating Dana's bicentennial August 1 birthday and will remain on display until mid-September.

Dr. Brown's ship models are recognized for their skilled craftsmanship and have been exhibited in a variety of museums and shows including the Maritime Museum of San Diego, the Smithsonian Institution, Mystic Seaport Museum, The Peabody Museum in Connecticut and the Los Angeles Maritime Museum.


