Steve and Barrie won multiple ASP World Tandem Championships and were featured on *ABC Wide World of Sports* and *LIFE* Magazine. They married in 1971 and together opened their new board shaping shop, *Infinity Surf Shop*, in an old gas station on 5th and PCH in Huntington Beach. They moved the shop to Dana Point to raise their children, Dave and Dan.

The statue of the duo is crafted by artist Bill Limebrook, who has been involved in the design of each of the bronze statues at Waterman's Plaza. Please join us on October 25 to celebrate our local legends.

Reserve Now for Our Tour of Historic Cottages of Crystal Cove State Park

Society members are invited to a guided tour of Crystal Cove State Park Historic Cottage District (pictured below) with Kate Wheeler, President & CEO of Crystal Cove Conservancy, on **Thursday, October 26, at 10 a.m.** The federally listed historic district is an enclave of 46 vintage rustic coastal cottages originally built as a seaside colony in the 1930s & `40s and nestled around the mouth of Los Trancos Creek. It is one of the last remaining examples of early 20th-century Southern California coastal development. The area is located off Pacific Coast Highway between Corona del Mar and Laguna Beach.

The tour is limited to the first 30 members and sign-up is required. A \$5 donation is suggested, which goes to Crystal Cove Conservancy. To make a reservation, contact the Society at 949-248-8121 or at Museum@DanaPointHistorical.org by Sunday October 22. After reserving, individuals will receive directions and meeting instructions. Carpooling is encouraged and there is a charge for parking in the Los Trancos lot.


September's activities have also concentrated on community outreach. Our volunteers manned

Bruce was chair of the Society's surfing and waterman history interests and together with his wife, Marlene, compiled and wrote a definitive history of watermen and women in our area entitled SURF, PADDLE & SAIL! Oceanic Heritage Journal of Dana Point. The journal is available on our website at DanaPointHistorial.org. Bruce was also an avid volunteer for many of our events, including our outreach booth and as a weekly museum docent. Additionally, he was responsible for procuring speakers for our evening programs on several occasions.

Bruce and Marlene were honored in 2016 by the Society at its annual Founders Day event for their contributions to Dana Point. The Society extends its sympathies to his family.

The Society also extends its sympathies to the family of Barbara Boyd, 86, who died in August. Barbara joined the DPHS Board of Directors in 1998 after retiring from teaching in 1997. She served as newsletter editor and also complied annual journals featuring the events of the Society. She became Vice President in 1999 and continued as newsletter editor through 2004, retiring from the board of directors in 2005 as a Lifetime Member. While active, Barbara and her husband, Bill, were on the Inaugural Home Tour Committee in 2000 and their Woodruff English provincial-style home was the signature home of the 2001 Woodruff Home Tour. She served on subsequent home-tour committees and was



both a home tour and museum docent. The Society will always be grateful for her dedication to our organization.
