Celebrating New Historic Designations and the Upcoming Holidays



Did you see the photo “Pavilion of the Past” on the cover of the Dana Point Times on October 28, 2022? Both the Palisades Gazebo Park and Pines Park have received historic designation by a unanimous vote of the Planning Commission on October 28th. The Dana Point Historical Society wrote a letter of support for both parks to be added to the Dana Point Historic Register due to their significance as part of the Doheny family’s development of Capistrano Beach in the 1920s. According to the Dana Point Times, Commissioner Eric Nelson stated “. . . a city

like ours that has been around for a long time before we were incorporated with a lot of history, the fact that the Doheny family is part of that history and this is a park that they built, is an important element.” The DPHS Preservation Chair attended the meeting and suggested that plaques could help residents and visitors learn more about the city’s development. Planning Commissioner John Gabbard suggested that the Historical Society work with the city on a narrative that conveys the history of the area and Capistrano Beach development. Our Board of Directors wishes to commend and thank the Planning Commission, the Planning Division, Toni Nelson, Keith Johannes and other Society members who contributed information for the parks historic register nominations to the City of Dana Point.

Our October Founders Day meeting honoring Joyce Hoffman was well attended by members and guests. The fascinated audience had interesting questions for Joyce, who explained why she chose surfing and how training for the sport led to international world championships. Joyce informed and entertained us with her amusing and candid answers. We were pleased to welcome friends of Joyce, including fellow surfers, Waterman’s Plaza sculptor Bill Limebrook and local author Joe Dunn and family. We hope to have a video of her informative talk online in the near future for those of you who were unable to join us for the meeting and reception. Special thanks to Joel Bishop, who organized the meeting in City Council Chambers, and Chair Elizabeth Bamattre and her committee who hosted the “Toast to Joyce” reception in the museum afterward.

The outreach booth at the October 30th Redo Market was a success with the help of the Board of Directors and volunteers who assisted in enlisting new members, taking historic photo orders, selling ornaments and other items. Special kudos to those who set up and took down the booth and its contents.

We have been busy this November with the introduction of our new Lantern Ornament and organizing our booth at the Winter Bazaar, a benefit for the city’s Age Well Senior Services. To date, nearly half of the 300 limited-edition ornaments have been sold. The \$35 ornament is \$30 to members (including tax), a 14% discount through December 22nd, after which the museum closes until 2023. For those of you who do not have our first ornament, the City of Dana Point Seal by local artist Rick Morgan, we have a limited supply remaining at the original price of \$25, less a 10% discount for members. Each ornament has an enclosure card that describes its historic significance. Our gratitude goes to Kirsten Reynolds for overseeing the creation of both these ornaments! We also have note cards printed with Louise Leyden’s paintings and “Point of Love” prints of harbor seals donated by local artist Maurine Lacher. All these items and more make wonderful holiday and hostess gifts. See page five for more gift ideas.

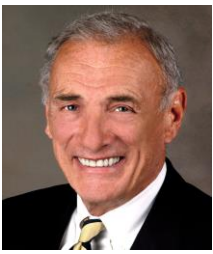

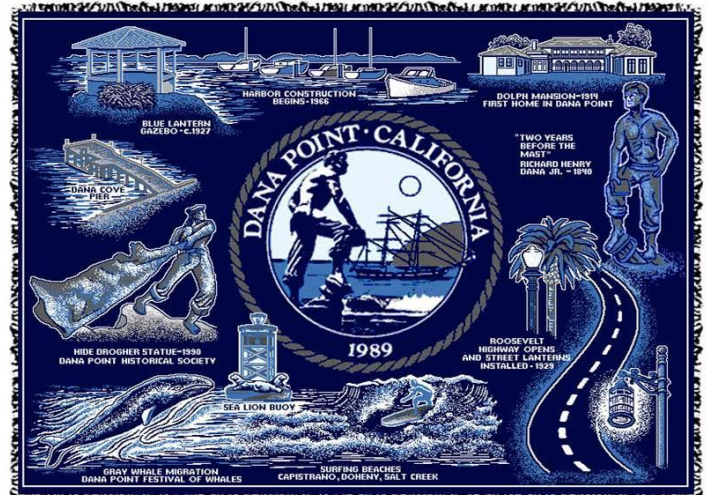
