DPHS Annual Meeting, Election and Dinner Wednesday, February 15

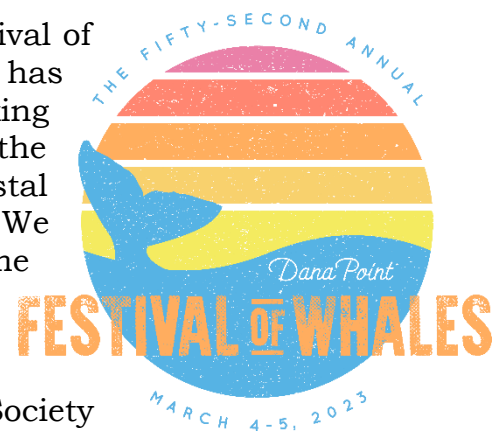

Mayors Sign Sister Cities Agreement

Dana Point Sister Cities Association has made history since we were honored to co-sponsor its June fundraiser. On December 6, 2022, the Dana Point City Council unanimously approved a Sister Cities Friendship Agreement with Sorrento, Italy. The council authorized the mayor to execute a Memorandum of Agreement and other ceremonial documents; it adopted a resolution of intention, approving a friendship agreement and declaring its intent to build a city-to-city relationship with Sorrento; and it authorized city staff to work with Dana Point Sister Cities International to build a “Sister City Relationship” with Sorrento. Mayor Joseph Muller signed the Memorandum of Agreement.

The goal is to promote international education exchanges with students of middle- and high-school age, realize common events in art, culture, music, theater and marine life preservation, and includes the history of the respective territories and their local foundations, museums and local associations. Currently, Dana Point Sister Cities Association is planning a cocktail party & priority-seating event at the Righteous Brothers Pacific Symphony Pops concert on February 10 to raise funds for an artist delegation visit to Sorrento.

We look forward to Bob Zasa, DPSCA President, updating us on the Sister Cities Association's recent activities at our Annual Meeting. It seems Sorrento's influence on Dana Point's early development, started nearly a century ago, will return as a mutual exchange of culture and friendship.

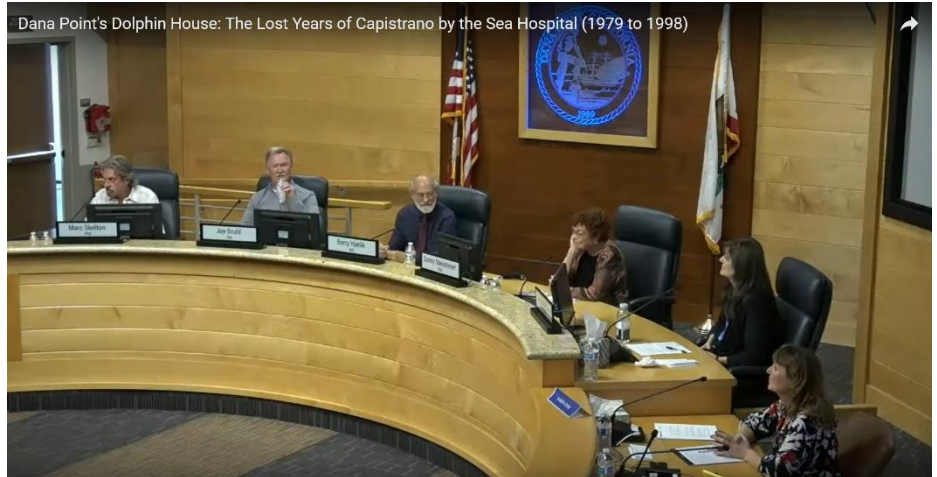
On Friday, January 13, 2023, a Memorandum of Agreement was signed by Mayor Mike Frost, City of Dana Point, County of Orange, California, USA, and Mayor Massimo Coppola of Sorrento, (Province of Naples), Italy, at a virtual 8:00 a.m. meeting (5:00 p.m. in Sorrento) at the Dana Point Chamber of Commerce. The mayors and official representatives of both cities committed to promote cooperation in tourism, arts, culture, education and mutual economic initiatives. Activities to accomplish this commitment include cultural and artistic exchanges, common events and experiences to expand cooperation and friendship, encourage tourism and support the cultural heritage of both cities including

The Capistrano by the Sea Hospital Archives

We have received an addition to our museum archives, a result of our May 2022 program, *The Lost Years of Capistrano by the Sea Hospital & Clinic*, which was presented by a panel of professionals employed at the hospital from the late 1970s until the facility closed in 1998. Barry Havlik, the panel's moderator, hopes sharing the archives will contribute to the legacy of the Dolph House, c.1955-1998, fill in some of the mystery surrounding the psychiatric hospital on the hill and reveal its contribution to the community, then and now. Many of the hospital's employees went on to serve in advanced professional careers.

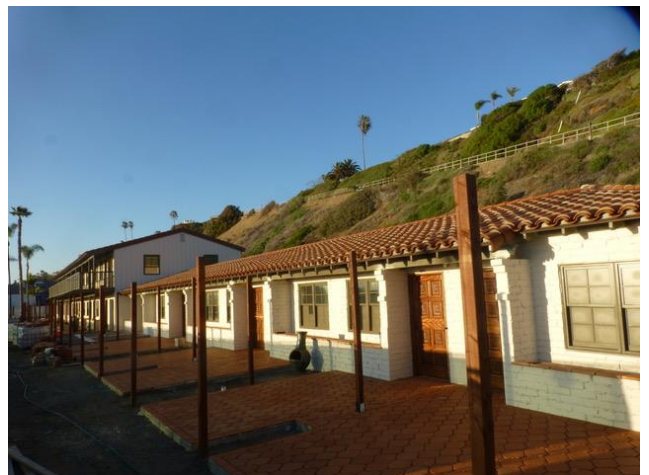
Aerial view of the Dolph house during its time as a psychiatric hospital and clinic.

Barry has described the large binder of materials as mostly original, unpolished documents, c.1980-1985, consisting of formal and anecdotal staff communications, marketing and program data, staff photos and clinical planning materials. Former employees who read this announcement are invited to submit additional information as available, which will be added to the archive. There are plans to eventually digitize the materials. The archives are available for public viewing during museum hours. Barry has retained the rights to these archives (including the movie rights). Our thanks to Barry for sharing these materials with Dana Point residents.
