

Historic Preservation Update

Two historic buildings are scheduled for demolition inside the Lantern District. The mid-century modern building at 34135 Pacific Coast Highway (PCH) will be demolished as part of the Majestic Housing and Development LLC project approved by the Dana Point City Council. The second proposed demolition is the historic Dana Plantation Motel at 34111 PCH. While the c. 1942-46 motel is on the city's Historic Resource Inventory and was recorded by the county on the California Historic Resource Inventory System, subsequent owners allowed it to deteriorate to the point where its condition and recent use did not bring together the support to save it. Some of the reasons given to demolish this historic building could be applied to any historic building currently on the City of Dana Point Historic Resource Inventory commissioned by the city in 1997. Neither the inventory nor the Historic Resource Register has been updated to identify historical resources that have changed, reached or will soon reach the 50-year age threshold for consideration as potential historic resources. In addition, Dana Point is not a Certified Local Government recognized by the California Office of Historic Preservation. The Historical Society is concerned that future plans for the remaining Woodruff historic buildings in the Lantern District Town Center are unknown. At a September meeting with the Community Planning Department, city staff indicated they would request approval for updating the city's Historic Resource Inventory in 2015. Thankfully, the Blue Lantern Fountain Lunch at 34091 PCH is on the city's Historic Register and is due to be restored. Our Preservation Committee met with the city and the building's restoration architect; we received positive responses to our preservation concerns.

2015 - The Year of Dana, His Bicentennial Year

With a spectacular mural of the Capistrano Bay coast as it was in Richard Henry Dana Jr.'s time as background, the fifth public community reading of Dana's *Two Years Before the Mast* will take place on March 27, 28 and 29th at the Nature Interpretive Center, 34558 Scenic Drive.



Over one hundred volunteer readers will read for eight to ten minutes each, completing the entire book in about 15 hours over three days. In addition, volunteers are needed to serve as "watch officers" to oversee and manage each watch (that means shift, to land lubbers).

The reading in 2015 marks the bicentennial year of our city's namesake. Richard Henry Dana Jr. was born on August 1, 1815. So come volunteer and join us – or just to watch and listen.

Saturday, March 28, 9am to 6pm
Sunday, March 29, 9am until we finish the book (around noon)

To celebrate this landmark year and to thank our volunteers we extend an invitation to our participants to attend a reception on Sunday, March 29, around noon – just as soon as the book confirms that Dana is safely back in Boston harbor at the end of his voyage.
